Blake Hall has experienced a remarkable rise through the ranks of fast bowlers during his time at the Dragons. He began his career playing 4<sup>th</sup> grade and achieved his standout season in the summer of 2005-06. A surprise choice as 4<sup>th</sup> grade captain that year, Hall led from the front and in his first game in charge picked up career-best figures of 7-8 from 14 overs, including 10 maidens. From that point on he hasn't looked back.

Hall picked up an astonishing 68 wickets that summer at an average of 11.1, his strike rate a phenomenal 32.6. The 4<sup>th</sup> grade side jumped on board the bandwagon to waltz into the semi- finals on the back of their skipper's efforts. The following year more of the same continued and he finished the summer playing 3<sup>s</sup> where he snared 5 wickets, and finally in 2<sup>s</sup> where he took 4 wickets, showing his potential in the higher grades.

The following summer he found it impossible to hide and was duly selected to play 2<sup>nd</sup> grade. Not long after that he was selected for the A grade team, debuting against his former club Fremantle. He has since been a permanent fixture of the A grade side, often sharing new ball duties with Lagana and batting way down at number 11. His probing line and length is a feature, as he gives batsmen nothing with his miserly in- swingers. He continually puts the ball on the spot, waiting for batsmen to lose their patience and make an error. What he lacks in pace he makes up in smarts, as a head that big surely has to be used for something!!
